

How will we help staff stay safe at Camp Akita?

Accurate testing and vaccines may mean Camp Akita 2021 will look more "normal" than we expect. For now, here are some ways we plan to help Camp Akita staff stay safe this summer.

Pre-camp screenings.

Up-to-date policies will help prevent both staff and campers from bringing COVID to camp or spreading it session-to-session.



The most current medical procedures will determine screening policies for summer 2021. Camp Akita plans to cover any out-of-pocket costs for testing or other screening required of staff.

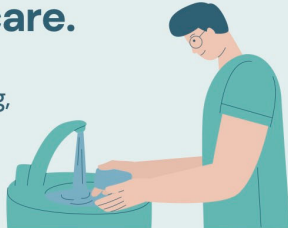
Limited exposure.

When camp is in session, staff will complete most activities with their cabin group. If a cabin mate has COVID, exposure will be limited to 10-12 people, not the full camp community.



Prevention & care.

Staff and campers will practice social distancing, hand washing, mask wearing, and wellness checks. On-site medical staff will provide care.



Rest time.

Our schedule will include time for rest. We want staff to be able to tell the difference between normal "camp fatigue" and something more serious.

Staff will enjoy dedicated time together and build genuine relationships, just as in summers past.

No full-summer bubble.

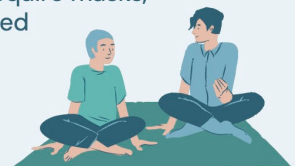
Staff can return home to receive care or take time off. We don't want staff feeling "trapped" at camp or prevented from receiving the mental or physical care they need.
